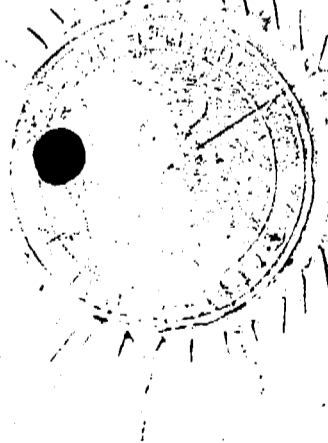

Personally appeared before me a Justice of

and State aforesaid. Wm. Grayson aged
sixty year a resident of the County and
State aforesaid who being duly sworn
according to law Declare that he is the identical
Wm Grayson who was a Private in the Company
commanded by Captain James Sumner
in the Tennessee Regiment of Militia command-
ed by ^{Colonel} John Anderson in the war with Great
Britain declared by the United States on the
19th day of June 1812. that he was drafted
at Knoxville in Knox County in the State
of Tennessee on or about the first of September
in the year our Lord 1814 for the term of six
months, and continued in actual service in
said war for the term of six months and was
honorably discharged at ~~Fort~~ Mobile in Fort
Charlotte, State of Alabama on or about the 20th
of March in the year of our Lord 1815. as will
appear by the muster rolls of his Company.
The said Wm Grayson further states that he has
lost his discharge above referred to By putting ^{it} in
the hands of his Brother Joseph Grayson who died
shortly afterwards and never returned said discharge
to the applicant which discharge is not now to be
recovered

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining
the bounty land to which he may be entitled
under the act granting bounty land to certain
officers and soldiers who have been engaged in
the military service of the United States

County land to which he may be entitled under
an act in addition to certain acts Granting
County land to certain officers and soldiers
who may have been engaged in the Military
Service of the United States approved the 30th
of March A.D. 1855.

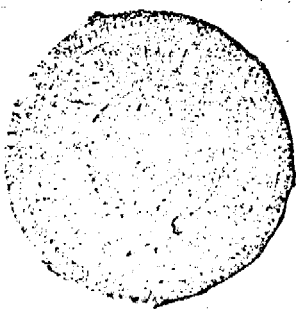

On the twelfth day of April one thousand eight hundred and fifty five personally appeared before me Sanford Grayson a Notary Public duly authorized by law to administer oaths for general purposes within and for the county and state aforesaid. Then Grayson aged seventy four years a resident of Decatur County in the State of Indiana who being sworn, declares that he is the identical Men Grayson who was a private in the Company commanded by Captain James Sumner in the Regiment of Militia commanded by Colonel John Anderson in the war with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June A.D. 1812. That he was drafted at Knoxville in Knox County State of Tennessee on or about the day of September 1812 for the term of six months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of five months and was honorably discharged at Mobile on or about the day of March A.D. 1814 on account of Peace being declared as will appear by the Muster Rolls of said Company on file that he has received a certificate of Discharge, but it is lost. That he has received a land warrant for eighty acres of land on account of said services, which he has legally disposed of ^{and cannot return} to the records on file he now seeks the support of this declaration for additional County land, ~~to which he is entitled~~

That he hereby constitutes and appoints Sanford Grayson of Decatur County Indiana his attorney to do all that may be necessary on this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the additional
